

Interview Questions Students might be asked

Tips

- Make eye contact and prepare to shake the interviewer's hand
- Be polite and speak clearly
- Address interviewer and adults respectfully: "Mr. Smith or Mrs. Howard", etc.
- Try not to answer questions with a "yes" or "no" or "I don't know." Expound on questions. Let them know what you think!
- Be yourself and try to relax! You are learning as much about the school as they are learning about you! (Reciprocal process)

Why are you interested in this school? Do you know anyone who has gone to this school?

What three things you would bring to this school?

What academic classes are your favorite and why?

Do you hold a leadership position at your school? Is that something you'd like to do at this school?

What type of sports are you involved with? (Particular teams, positions)

Do you like music/art? What type of music do you like? Do you sing in a chorus? Do you play an instrument? Are you involved with acting? Do you want to continue with these interests?

Do you like to write? What do you like to write about?

Have you ever been involved with a community service project? What was it and what did you learn from this project?

Do you read outside of school? If so, what types of books do you like? Why? If not, what books that you have read in school do you like? And why?

Favorite movies, television shows, etc...what do you like about them?

What do you like to do with your friends outside of school? Do you have any hobbies?

What does your typical day look like? How much time do you spend doing your homework? How do you organize your time?

How do you solve problems? Can you give an example?

Do you spend a lot of time on the computer? Doing what?

What activities do you like to do with your family? Do you have a favorite vacation?
